Blanche Kelso Bruce Academy is a Strict Discipline Academy offering services at multiple locations. During the course of the school year, the district serves over 3,000 students providing traditional and non-traditional educational services thru state of the art programming such as "Big Picture Learning." The locations are Blanche Kelso Bruce Academy (BKBA) Conner High School serving grades 9-12, BKBA Cecil Middle School serving grades 5-8, BKBA Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF) serving all grade levels and DePaul which is a satellite programs serving grades 6-12. Each site is located within the City of Detroit. Over 95% of our students quality for Free and/or Reduced lunch and all are identified as At-Risk.

The facility at each of our sites represent a diverse culture of highly qualified teachers who have committed themselves to the education of our unique and often underachieving students.

Our most challenging aspect is how do we motivate our students to prepare for the future through the educational process.

Vision: Our philosophy of education is based on the belief that each child can learn and succeed, that diversity enriches us all, that students at risk of failure can overcome the risk through involvement in a thoughtful and caring community of learners, that each child has unique contributions to offer to the community of learners, that each child has strengths and needs, and that effective learning results from the collaborative efforts of all engaged adult constituencies.

Mission: The mission of the Blanche Kelso Bruce Strict Discipline Academy (SDA) is to provide effective educational services to students, who due to legal/or other environmental risk factors impacting their lives, are unable to participate in regular school settings, and/or are identified as at-risk of academic failure in traditional school environments.

Due to the fact that our students come with many at risk factors, we offer the Discovery Assessment which consists of a battery of diagnostic tools given to new students to assess their academic and behavior status and provide educational programming that is suitable to their academic needs. To assist with the educational programming, students are given assessments such as Scantron Performance Series, and Read 180. At the high school level, we have implemented the "Big Picture Learning" model. Utilizing the combined results from the assessments, the Big Picture Learning model assists advisor/ teachers along with students, parents and guardians to develop individual learning plans designed to help students progress toward the completion of graduation requirements and career readiness activities such as exhibitions and internships.

#### **Notable Achievements and Areas of Improvement**

Our notable achievement includes our graduating class of students, of which, most have been accepted into an institution of higher learning.

Additionally, for the 2014-2015 school year, we will continue to implement "Big Picture Learning," which is an educational program designed specifically to help at risk students determine their career path though academic achievement, mentors, internships, and individual exhibitions. This is our second year of implementation, and we have learned through some trails and a few tribulations. But mostly we are discovering what students really want to become successful and as a result they are on a career path to define and achieve their goals. After completion of the first half of the 2013-14 school year, we reorganized into a grade 6-8 middle school and a grade 9-12 high school programs with the exception of JDF which enrollment is at all grade levels. This reorganization will reinforce our efforts to effectively service the needs of our entire population.

Meetings were held throughout the school year so that all stakeholders could be engaged in the development of the District and Local School Plan. Meetings were held at the district or local sites in December, 2013, January, 2014, February, 2014, March, 2014, May, 2014. June, 2014. Stakeholders included representatives from the authorizer, staff from each site, district administrators and a Board member. Representatives from these groups were involved in the development, implementation and monitoring of our district and school improvement planning. Information was shared at meetings and at local site meet and greet activities where stakeholders shared their suggestions for improvement as well as the activities that they agreed should continue. By working together, we ensure that priorities are clear, improvement efforts are aligned with priorities, and results are used for future planning.

Teachers from BKBA-JDF, East (Connor), and West (Cecil). A significant amount of discussion revolved around the implementation of Big Picture Learning (the education model introduced at the beginning of the 2012-13 school year). It was agreed that this was the second year of implementation and a great deal of training was still necessary in order for the teachers and staff to continue to make the transition from traditional high school to one that is project driven and involves a great deal of student self-motivation. Most of the staff agreed that the change from instructor-teacher to advisor would require a great deal of understanding, patience, knowledge and a willingness to change their educational methods. This acceptance of this change continues to occur.

Students had some success and most of them liked going out on internships.

Students - in order to receive a passing mark of B or higher they had to successfully complete an exhibition or project. This process was repeated every 10 weeks. Students progressed as they repeated the process.

Administrators and teachers: Both groups agree that professional staff development is essential and a great deal of it should be planned for the next few years with the major focus on Big Picture Learning processes and Differentiating Instruction.
